Reception enjoyed their first open fire experience at Forest School this week. They toasted marshmallows over the fire and ate them with some warm hot chocolate!












Year 2 designers had a busy day today. They worked together to practise running stitch, chose their thread colour, and then began sewing their puppet. They even learnt how to do finishing stitch. After that, they made a design drawing to show the character of their puppet.


















### Year 3

Our Year 3 mathematicians were learning new strategies to divide. They used base ten and place value grids to show how to divide a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number by partitioning the value that is being divided. The children then divided the tens and ones into equal groups (as many as the 1-digit number). Well done team!





#### <u>Year 5</u>

The Year 5 maths masterclass team went to their final session which focused on probability. They looked at the idea of the lottery, how you choose 6 numbers out of 59, and the probability of you winning. To do this, we looked at a smaller sample of 5 numbers choosing either 2, or 3 out of the 5. This all connected back to our first session when we looked at Pascal's triangle. We found out that the chance of you winning in the national lottery was around 1 in 47 million!













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### <u>Year 6</u>

Year 6 had a really informative trip yesterday to the Thames Barrier Information Centre. We explored the history of the River Thames, and how the Thames Barrier prevents London from flooding. Once the fog eventually lifted, we got to see the Thames Barrier up close.




