Y4 - 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s, 6s, 7s, 8s, 9s, 10s, 11s & 12s

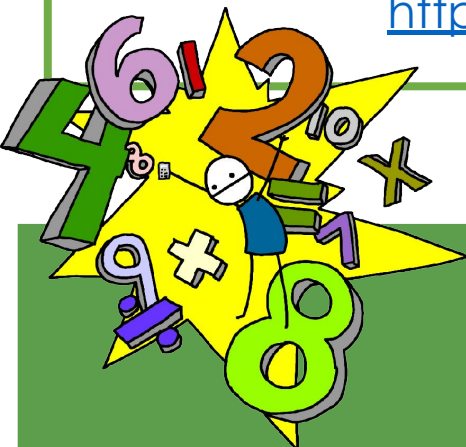

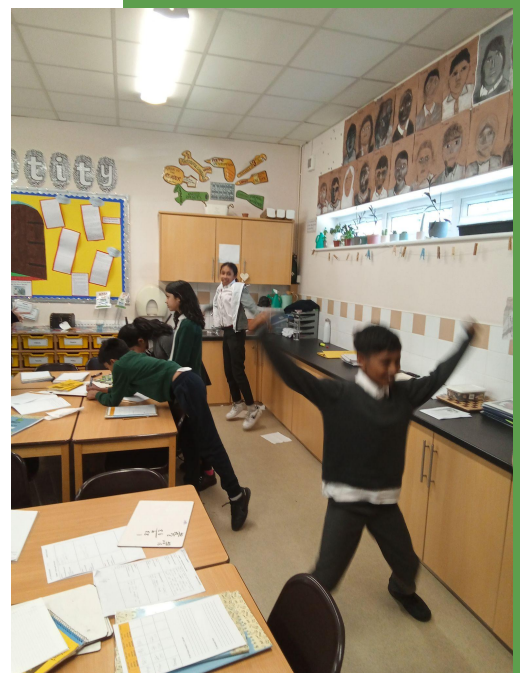
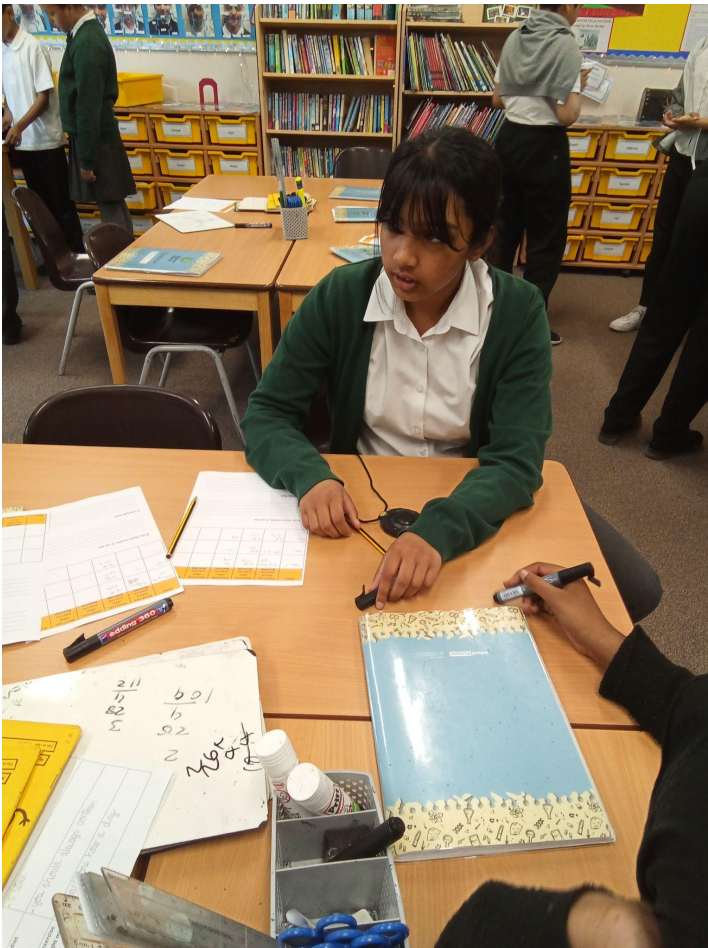
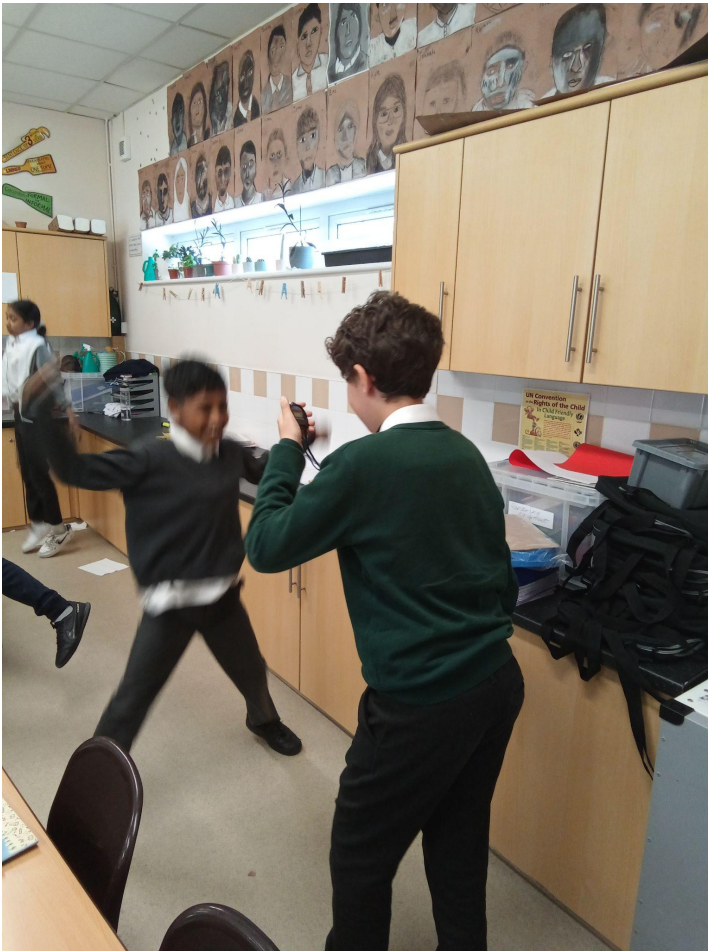
Year 2

Year 6

Here are some photos of Year 6s science experiment testing to see the effect of exercise on heart rate. During the lesson, they learnt that their pulse rate is an indicator of their heart rate. They located their pulse points and measured their resting heart rate. Then they completed some exercises and measured their heart rate again. After the experiment, they all reached the conclusion that exercise elevates your heart rate because it needs to pump oxygenated blood quicker around the body.



Year 3

The mini-scientists of Year 3 began their new Living Things & their Habitats unit in science this week. We learnt about how organisms are classified into 4 key groups (animals, plants, bacteria and fungi) and then broke animals down into further classifications (mammals, amphibians, reptiles, insects, birds and fish). Then, focusing on Insects, the children in groups had a go at organising this group in a variety of ways creating their own categories based on today's learning.
