Let's talk about: **reading.** What's so special about reading?

Why do we keep going on about it? Well, there's 2 big reasons really.

Firstly, it may be the most important academic skill you will ever learn because, once you can read, you have access to everything that's written. You can keep learning even when you're alone.

Secondly, the world of books can take you anywhere! We want children to really **LOVE** reading and to know that ...

Reading gives you wings!

So, how does someone get better at reading?

- **learn the sounds** in English and how to read & write them. We do this in phonics lessons every day
- understand that **words carry meaning**; that a writer is trying to tell you something and that you need to look for that meaning
- practice, practice; no one ever got great at anything by doing it once or twice

A successful reader will be able to **decode** – that is, read what the words say – and **comprehend** – that is, understand what they mean.

How can you help?

- 1. Your child's teacher may invite you to workshops or send home information about how we teach reading and how you can support. The more you can **engage** with these, the more confident you will feel helping your child.
- 2. Make sure really make sure that your child is **reading at home** every day. At least **20 minutes**. If they are in reception to Y2, they should be reading their phonics book to you every day.
- 3. Your children look up to you; be a good role model if they see you reading, they'll see that it's a good thing to do for themselves.

















Year 1

Year 5























Year 3

Admission to Year 7 (secondary school) 2024

If you live in Tower Hamlets and your child is in Year 6 (born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013) you will need to make an online application via the E-admissions website for them to transfer to secondary school in September 2024.

Admission to Reception (primary school) 2024

Please read the <u>Starting Primary School in Tower Hamlets</u> <u>booklet</u> for useful information on the admission process.

Pupils usually start primary school in the September following their fourth birthday. If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 this will be from September 2024.

You must make an online application for a reception place, even if your child is already attending the school's nursery.


School admissions application deadlines

Year 6 parents/carers must apply for a secondary place by Tuesday 31 October 2023.

Nursery parents/carers must apply for a Reception place by Monday 15th January 2024.

If you have or know someone with a child born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021, you must apply for a Nursery place by Friday 16th February 2024. This is for for a nursery place for September 2024.

All applications must be completed via the e-admissions portal.
