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Year 3 Maths


Maths in Year 3 today was learning all about flexible partitioning of numbers to 1000. We all know how to partition a number into hundreds, tens and ones, but today we began to investigate non-standard partitioning of those numbers. Well done team!






Year 5


We learned what chronological order was by writing our birthdays on our whiteboards and then arranging ourselves in a chronological order. After we had completed this task, we learned about timelines and tested our knowledge by drawing timelines of our day, and of our term. We then learned about the different periods of the Greek empire, the Dark Age, Archaic Age, the Hellenistic Age and the Classical Age. Using used strips of paper for our timeline, and different coloured post its for year markers (orange), different civilisations (green) and different ages of the Ancient Greek empire (yellow) - we found out when the Ancient Greeks lived, and when this was in comparison to other civilisations.















Reception Role Play



Admission to Year 7 (secondary school) 2024

Please read the <u>Ready for Secondary School in Tower</u> <u>Hamlets booklet</u> for useful information on the admission process.

If you live in Tower Hamlets and your child is in Year 6 (born between 1 September 2012 and 31 August 2013) you will need to make an online application via the E-admissions website for them to transfer to secondary school in September 2024.

Admission to Reception (primary school) 2024

Please read the <u>Starting Primary School in Tower Hamlets</u> <u>booklet</u> for useful information on the admission process.

Pupils usually start primary school in the September following their fourth birthday. If your child was born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020 this will be from September 2024.

You must make an online application for a reception place, even if your child is already attending the school's nursery.


School admissions application deadlines

Year 6 parents/carers must apply for a secondary place by Tuesday 31 October 2023.

Nursery parents/carers must apply for a Reception place by Monday 15th January 2024.

If you have or know someone with a child born between 1 September 2020 and 31 August 2021, you must apply for a Nursery place by Friday 16th February 2024. This is for for a nursery place for September 2024.

All applications must be completed via the e-admissions portal.
