**What have I learnt already:**

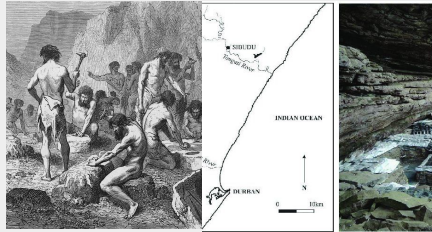
In Year 1, you learnt that sources give you information about the past

**Key knowledge that will be learnt**

Through using different sources you will find out what happened during the Great Fire of London in 1666.



You will learn to place the key events of the fire in chronological (time) order.



Christopher Wren was a significant architect who built a monument to the people who lost their lives during the fire.



Through looking at different sources, you will find out how firefighters put fire out and how houses are built safely now because of what happened during the GFoL.

You will learn about how Stone Age people used tools to hunt and make fire. The Sibudu cave discoveries in South Africa tell us how Stone Age people lived through the artwork found.

Word	Definition
source	A photo, object, writing, or piece of film or music that tells us about the past
Stone Age	A prehistoric period where humans began using stone for tools
diversity	Having lots of ways that people/things are different
firefighter	People whose jobs are to put out fires and tell people how to be safe with fire.
representation	To be a sign or symbol of something or someone
