Knowledge Organiser: Art & Design

Theme: Fire! Fire!

Key knowledge that will be learnt:

The work of an author/illustrator called Cressida Cowell. She uses her imagination to create creatures and new worlds.



That artists can make marks, lines & tones for expressive effect.



That colours can be cool or hot.

Key knowledge that will be learnt:

Dragon fireholes are not just for firing flames. Dragon fireholes are an extraordinary natural feature, and they are unique to dragons. In smaller dragons they are invisible to the naked eye. These holes can also shoot lightning bolts, or spew a flow of acid in the case of this MASSIVE Leviathorgian.



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So some dragons, the holes shoot poisonous or 6-7-8-9-10-11-12 gas. Greshuffers swallow large stones that are then ejected through the fire-holes with the force of CANNON PAWS.



Using collage, you will learn about how an artist thinks about the composition of an artwork.

Key Vocabulary	
collage	cutting out, arranging & gluing drawings, paintings and photos onto a flat surface to create a picture
composition	how an artist arranges different elements in an artwork
landscape	a picture showing a view of the land. It can include mountains, rivers, buildings and trees
blend	to create a gentle change between colours or tones
texture	the way a surface feels, or looks like it would feel in a drawing or painting
tone	the lightness or darkness of something
