
Accessing building

Year 1

This week, Year 1 learnt about rulers. They looked at how to measure length and what units of measure are used (cm). They know how to use a ruler and were able to have a go measuring objects around the class. Year 1 also had a go at using rulers to draw lines of our own.

Year 2

This week Year 2 started a new unit of learning on fractions. They began by identifying the fractions for a half and a quarter. They learnt a half is one of two equal parts and a quarter is one of four equal parts. They then were given shapes with fractions shaded in and they had to sort them into the correct groups.




Year 5


Year 5 visited the Royal Observatory in Greenwich last week, enjoying an incredible show in the Planetarium, a taught session on our solar system and a tour around the time museum, gigantic telescope and Meridian Line.

In computing, Year 5 used selection and conditions to control the flow of actions in a program. They experimented with different combinations so they could animate their characters.



Year 5

Year 5 continued their materials learning in Science by focussing on how to separate mixtures. They were given different mixtures (e.g. salty water and coffee arind in cold water) and asked to discover the best way to separate the two mixtures! Arya and Fariha are filtering, salty water was left on the radiator so that the water evaporated and the salt was left behind, and sieving was used to separate rice and flour.



I am pleased to invite you and any of your keen runners to an open and free running event organised by Victoria Park Harriers and Tower Hamlets Athletics Club on Saturday 16th March 2024.

There are two events for juniors. These are as follows:

1:40pm 1 mile race for U11 (7-10 year olds) 2.00pm 2.6 mile race for U17, U15 and U13 (11-16 year olds).

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
