Who Is King Charles III?

- Full name:** Charles Phillip Arthur George
- Full title:** Charles the Third, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of His other Realms and Territories King, Defender of the Faith.
- Date of birth:** 14th November 1948
- Date of accession:** 8th September 2022 (formally declared 10th September 2022)
- He was the first child of Princess Elizabeth, (later Queen Elizabeth II) and the first grandchild of King George VI.
