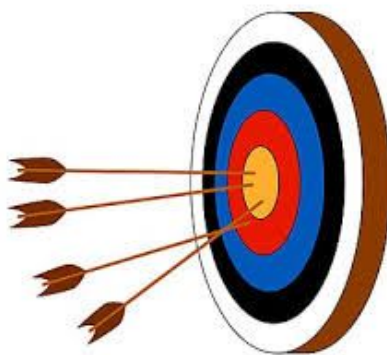

Reception have plastered the walls with their missing posters. Have you seen the missing Supertato?! Read the description to find out more about what he looks like so that you can keep an eye out.



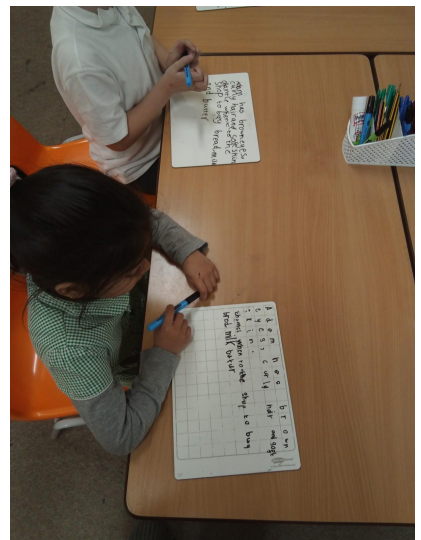
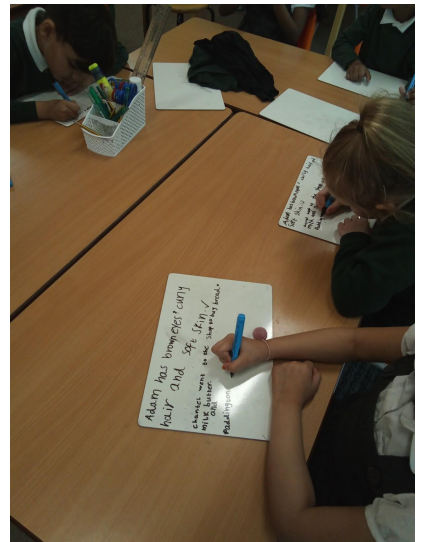
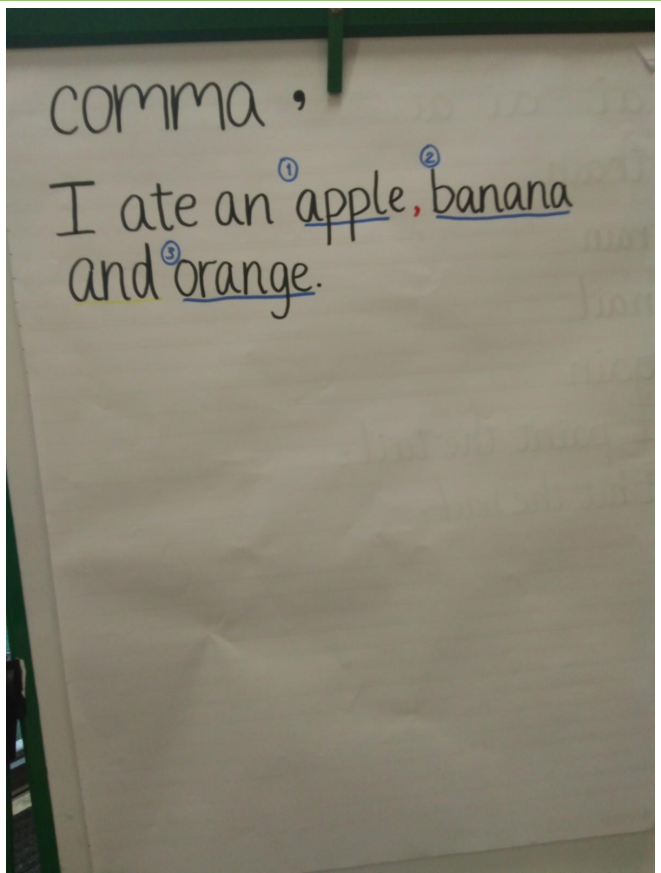

Year 1




Year 2





Year 3

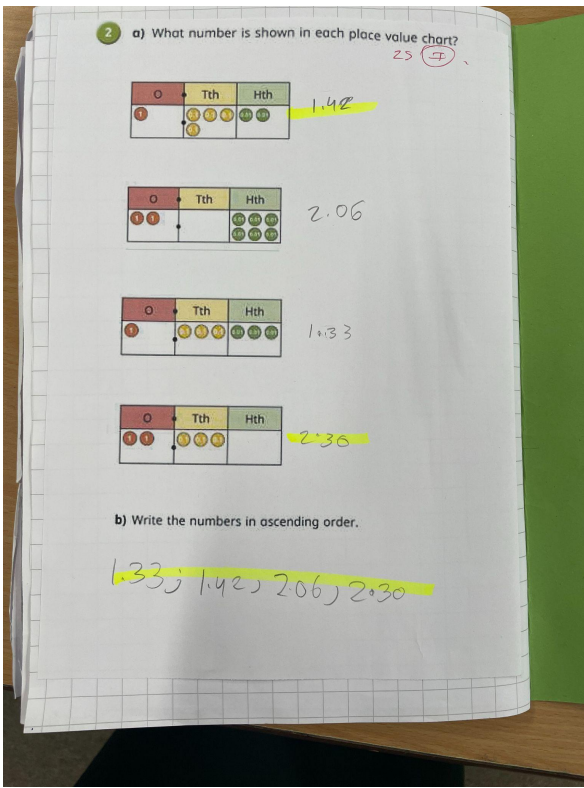
Y3 are making clay masks inspired by those made by the ancient Maya.

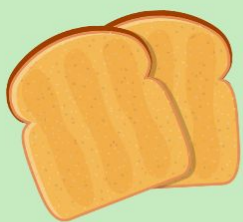
