



Year 1

This week in maths, Year 1 were introduced to statistics. We have been looking at pictograms and exploring how data is represented. With our talk partners, we made our own pictograms about Year One's Favourite Landmarks. From our data, London Eye was the most popular and Buckingham Palace was the least popular. 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Year 3

Year 3 had the most incredible time at Kew Botanical Gardens last Friday. We started off strong exploring all the elements plants need to grow in the children's garden . We then ventured into the Treetop Walkway. This was undoubtedly one of the highlights of the day. Walking among the treetops us a bird's-eye view of the gardens and a sense of what it felt like being high up in the canopy. Next, we took a stroll into the stunning Palm House, where we were surrounded by a lush variety of tropical plants. We were fascinated by the towering palms and vibrant flowers, and the humid environment gave us a taste of what it feels like to be in a rainforest. We ended our visit with a trip with a visit to the Princess of Wales Conservatory. We were particularly excited to see the carnivorous plants section. We amazed by the Venus flytraps, different types of cactus and pitcher plants, learning how these plants trap and digest their prey.

Our trip to Kew Botanical Gardens was an extraordinary adventure filled with learning, exploration, and fun. We all left with a deeper appreciation for the natural world and deeper curiosity about the plants around us.

Year 6

Year 6 has been exploring the different reasons why people migrate in their history lessons. The children have interviewed someone that they know has migrated to the UK and interviewed them to find out their reason for migration and their experiences.

They are now putting together a presentation to share with their class.

Year 2

This week Year 2 have begun learning all about the capacity of objects. First they were ask to measure the capacity of beakers in cups. They had to see how many full cups it would take to fill each beakers. They were then able to order the beakers from the least to greatest capacity.

Next, the children were introduced to millilitres and litres to allow them to accurately measure amounts. They were given three potions to make with specific measurements. They accurately measured the ingredients in ml and then mixed them to discover what colour the potions would make.


