All Tudor children wore dresses. At 7 years old boys would start to wear breeches (like the trousers in the picture).

You can still see some Tudor buildings around London today. They have a distinctive black and white style, with exposed wooden beams and high roofs.



Queen Elizabeth was the first ruling queen in England. Her army defeated the Spanish Armada and she is remembered one of the strongest leaders of time.
