We are excited to celebrate Eid together at school with Eid parties when the children return on Tuesday. The children can wear their party clothes to school and we look forward to seeing the children enjoying the festivities with their friends!

We warmly invite the Year 3 and Year 2 parents to next week's performance of Wind in the Willows on Friday morning. We are eagerly anticipating showcasing the children's hard work and talent! Please join us for what promises to be a wonderful performance.

Well done to Year 3 for 99.33% attendance last week! DfE research shows that at KS2, pupils who attended school **nearly every day** in Year 6 (with an attendance rate of **95-100%**) were **1.3 times more likely** to achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths compared to pupils who only attended **90-95%** of the time. This means missing just **10 days** of Year 6 reduced the likelihood of reaching the expected standard by around **25%**.

Finally, I want to take a moment to acknowledge a significant milestone at Bygrove. Next week marks Christina's last week with us after an incredible 33 years of dedicated service to our Bygrove community. Her commitment, passion and unwavering support has touched the lives of countless children and families over the years. We will be celebrating her remarkable contribution with the children next week. Please join us in wishing Christina all the very best for a happy and fulfilling retirement.

Safeguarding



Al generated content and Al tools like chatbots, content generators and summaries are quickly appearing across popular online apps and services. There are also popular Al tools appearing like ChatGPT.

There can be many positives to the use of AI in helping to find information, making creative content and getting support quickly through chat functions. However, as with other areas of online use, it comes with risks to children as well.

For example, the content that children see might not be age appropriate, legal or promote healthy behaviours. They can also experience harms such as bullying and sexual abuse through the misuse of AI content generators to create realistic looking content intended to cause harm.

## How Safe is WhatsApp for Children - NSPCC

WhatsApp is one of the most popular instant messaging apps, used by over 2 billion people in 180 countries. It allows you to send and receive messages, as well as make voice and video calls. You can connect with people individually or join group chats where lots of people can contribute. All you need to set up a WhatsApp account is a phone number. However, children and young people can easily subvert the restrictions placed on its access. Although rated at 16+, all that is required is a phone number. All it takes is one child in a class to be on whatsapp, and all the others will wish to join. This can lead to increased vulnerabilities for child users. 

This week in D&T, Year 5 have connected two geared motors to their crumble controller. They then created programs to make a simple buggy move. To do this, the children had to make the code, run the code, disconnect the USB lead from crumble, put the buggy on the floor and turn the battery pack on.







This week, Year 5 carried out a science experiment to help explain that some changes result in the formation of new materials and that this kind of change is not usually reversible including changes associated with burning.
