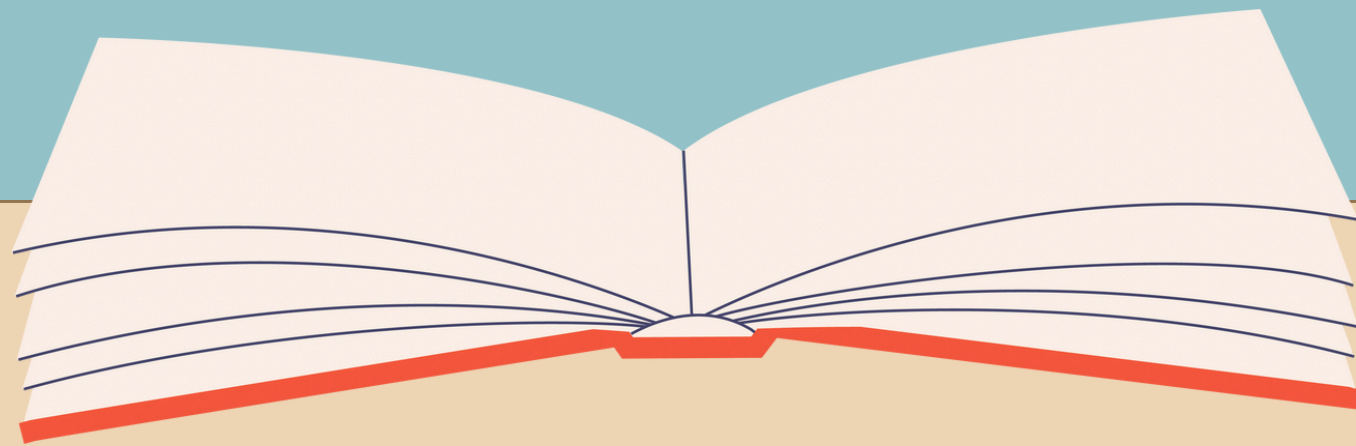



# **WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?**

**DAILY STORYTIME CAN IMPROVE A CHILD'S READING AGE BY 13 MONTHS IN JUST ONE TERM.**

**65% OF BOYS AND 76% OF GIRLS AGREED THAT STORYTIME MADE THEM FEEL CALM.**

**TEACHERS ALSO SHARED THE POSITIVE IMPACT ON THEIR OWN MENTAL HEALTH AND BONDING WITH THE CLASS.**



One in ten children aged three to ten never choose to read at home without parental input, according to a new survey published today by the national children's reading charity Coram Beanstalk, conducted in partnership with Mumsnet.
