Safeguarding



Al generated content and Al tools like chatbots, content generators and summaries are quickly appearing across popular online apps and services. There are also popular Al tools appearing like ChatGPT.

There can be many positives to the use of AI in helping to find information, making creative content and getting support quickly through chat functions. However, as with other areas of online use, it comes with risks to children as well.

For example, the content that children see might not be age appropriate, legal or promote healthy behaviours. They can also experience harms such as bullying and sexual abuse through the misuse of AI content generators to create realistic looking content intended to cause harm.

How Safe is WhatsApp for Children - NSPCC

WhatsApp is one of the most popular instant messaging apps, used by over 2 billion people in 180 countries. It allows you to send and receive messages, as well as make voice and video calls. You can connect with people individually or join group chats where lots of people can contribute. All you need to set up a WhatsApp account is a phone number. However, children and young people can easily subvert the restrictions placed on its access. Although **rated at 16+**, all that is required is a phone number. All it takes is one child in a class to be on whatsapp, and all the others will wish to join. This can lead to **increased vulnerabilities** for child users. Nursery

In Forest School this week, Nursery continued to make dens. It was very exciting to practise tying knots. We also helped Sherin with watering and planting, using our tools very carefully. Because of the hot rainy weather, we saw lots of slugs and newts around the science garden!



Year 1

This week Year 1 have been exploring their senses in science. They were tasked with identifying all five senses; touch, taste, sight, smell and hearing. They then did a carousel of activities in which they had to use one of their senses to help them record their findings. Lots of the children were able to accurately identify which sense they were using and how it helps them to explore the world around them.



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This week in maths, Year 1 have been exploring and comparing amounts up to 100. They were able to confidently use dienes to represent the amounts and then use the greater than, less than and equal to symbols to make a direct comparison between the two numbers. Some children were so confident they were able to simply write the number itself and make the comparison.



Year 3

Year 3 have been learning to identify the different parts of a plant and understand their functions. Through careful observation and plant dissection, the children explored how roots, stems, leaves, and flowers each play an important role in a plant's life cycle and growth. In the coming weeks, they will continue their scientific enquiry by carrying out experiments to investigate what plants need to grow and stay healthy.



Year 5

Last week, Year 5 went on a trip to the Olympic Park for geography where they had to identify different land use and complete a tally chart.

Make sure you have an Asthma and Allergy Plan at home and school

summer so you are protected from the triggers such as colds and virus which start once you are back at school If your childs asthma is* Check you know how use a worse give blue inhaler more regular 2 puffs at a time if needing more than 3 times or NEEDING MORE THAN 10 PUFFS EVERY 4 HOURS? See your GP or hospital asthma team - you may need extra medication or even hospitalisation

In an emergency

Think: Are they coughing, wheezing, breathing difficulty, tight chest. admissions. Intervene: Reassure the child, sit them upright and slightly forward. Medicine: Give 10 puffs of the blue inhaler using a spacer.

Emergency: If there is no improvement or if you are worried call 999. If you're waiting for an ambulance give another 10 puffs of salbutamol.

Mart therapy has a different management follow your asthma plan If your asthma is worse, you can use up to 12 puffs in 24 hours including your normal twice daily doses.

In an emergency

Think: Are they coughing, wheezing, breathing difficulty, tight chest. support your childs Eczema with this School care plan. Intervene: Reassure the child, sit them upright and slightly forward. Medicine: Take 1 inhalation of Symbicort Turbohaler. Wait 1–3 minutes. If no improvement in symptoms take another inhalation of A REAL PROPERTY.

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Allergy Always carry 2 pens and antihistamines with you at all times it could save vour life

If Having an asthma attack and your reliver is not working, follow your allergy Plan ADRENALINE PEN IF IN DOUBT - USE IT !!!!

There may be no signs as the signs of an anaphylaxis (severe allergic reaction) may not always be obvious.

Schedule an asthma review every year or after an attack

You should have an asthma review with your GP/ Practice nurse or Pharmacist at least once a year for a new spacer and individual asthma/allergy plan that must be taken to school.

Book one earlier if:

- you NEED your Reliver inhaler more than 3 times a week
- you have frequent daytime asthma symptoms, or your asthma is waking you up at night.
- you have attended the emergency department or needed steroid tablets or liquid for your symptoms. Booking an asthma review during the summer holidays may prevent a term time asthma attack

Consider air quality and triggers that impact your lung health

Indoor and outdoor pollution effects asthma find out more. You can help by walking or scoot to school avoiding main roads walking along quieter roads. If you must drive turn off your engines when stationary. For more information on air quality check out the website.

Treating your Hayfever treats your Asthma: Take your hay fever medication and nasal spray daily in the summer months when the pollen is high Contact your GP or Nurse if your hay fever is not controlled

Breathing in mould spores makes your asthma worse causing more coughing, wheeze and allergic rhinitis make sure you use mould spores to reduce the level.

Advice on how mould affects Asthma contact your council to make repairs and Report it. If you are having difficulties in getting repairs, you can get support, complain or legal advice.

If you need help with cost of living.
