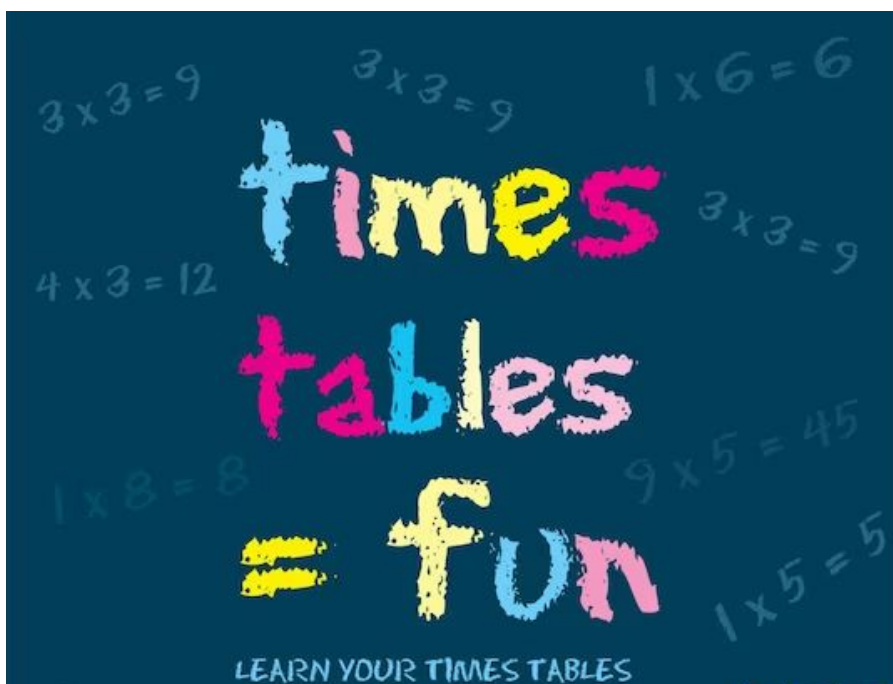


The children in the SLS became ecologists this week. They investigated the changes we see around us as we enter the season of autumn. They observed colours, textures, sounds and smells associated with autumn.

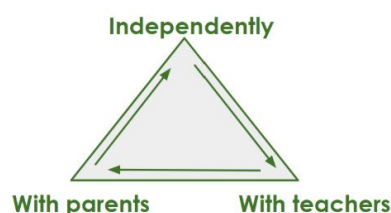
Times Tables

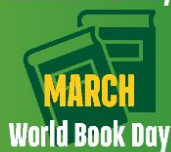
