- **Colours:** **Bottle Green**
- **Core Items:** A white shirt and a green jumper, cardigan, or sweatshirt with or without the Bygrove logo. Black or grey trousers or skirts are acceptable.
- **Summer Term:** Green and white check dresses are suitable.
- **Footwear:** **Black** trainers or flat-heeled **black** shoes or sandals.
- **PE Kit:**
 - **Indoor:** Shorts and T-shirts in school colours.
 - **Outdoor:** A warm top, jogging bottoms and trainers are required.
- **Headwear:** Headscarves may be worn in school colours (green, grey, black, or white).

Year 2 have been preparing for the festivities of Christmas this week, showcasing their creativity through their sewing skills to create and decorate Christmas stockings.





Year 4





Year 3

This week in D&T the Year 3 children have been working on weaving. They are attempting to make their very own bookmarks for them to use with their reading books. They worked together to cut 1 metre of yarn before using the pattern of under, over, under, over and round. The children had to pay close attention to ensure they did not pull the yarn too tight. Stay tuned to see the results in the next couple of weeks.



In English, the Year 3 children have been learning the skill of show and not tell through a recount. They were given scenes from their story maps and they had to act out the scene and freeze in one of the actions. They then had to explore the emotions, expressions, body movements and the thoughts the character might have. This helped the children to understand how show not tell gives us clues about the characters emotions.



Year 3 have been working on their stained glass windows for the Christmas decorations. The children carefully selected their colours of tissue paper before placing them onto their designs. 
